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Shopping Paradise

Central

The central business district houses designer boutiques and malls such as The Landmark, The Galleria, Prince's Building and Alexandra House. Li Yuen Street East and Li Yuen Street West are lined with street stalls selling a variety of clothing and accessories, while Hollywood Road offers a grand selection of antiques and curios.

Admiralty

In Pacific Place Mall, you will find over 130 shops including Marks & Spencer, Lane Crawford, Seibu and other designer stores.

Sheung Wan

Chinese handicrafts and fabric can be found in Western Market. The area to the west is famed for medicinal herbs and dried seafood. Cat Street Bazaar is best known for antiques and curios.

Wan Chai

Rattan and Chinese furniture shops line Queen's Road East. Buyers can even arrange to have their purchases sent home.

Tsim Sha Tsui

Harbor City, Ocean Terminal, Ocean Center, Marco Polo Hong Kong Hotel Arcade and Star House form a huge shopping and entertainment complex on the waterfront of Canton Road. Also abundant in Tsim Sha Tsui are jewelry shops and tailors as well as electronics in Nathan Road's "Golden Mile".

Yau Ma Tei & Mong Kok

You can find the Bird Market on Yuen Po Street, the Flower Market on Flower Market Road and the Jade Market at the junction of Kansu and Battery streets. Inexpensive amulets, necklaces and trinkets can be found in the Jade Market.



Dine Around

Noted as one of the culinary capitals of the world, Hong Kong has the best in Chinese cuisine and also an extensive range of other Asian and international restaurants. Hong Kong people have a passion for food and meals are fundamental to social interaction.

Cantonese cuisine is predominant and is known for its rich taste and freshness. Probably the most famous form of Cantonese food is dim sum which is eaten in the morning or early afternoon.

Other popular **regional Chinese** cuisines in Hong Kong include Beijing, Sichuan and Chiu Chow. **Southeast Asian** and **Indian** cuisines are also prominent and are characterized by hot and spicy food, especially the increasingly popular Thai dishes.

Dining Etiquette

Using chopsticks properly is essential, as is waiting for the host to start eating or serve you first. When taking

food from the center of the table, it is proper to put it into your bowl first before eating it. It is polite to pour tea for fellow diners before filling your own cup.

Currency

Legal tender is the Hong Kong dollar (HK\$). There are 100 cents in a dollar.

Coins: Bronze - 10 cents, 20 cents, 50 cents

Silver - HK\$1, HK\$2, HK\$5 Nickel & Bronze - HK\$10

Bank notes: HK\$10, HK\$20, HK\$50, HK\$100,

HK\$500, HK\$1,000

The value of the Hong Kong dollar is pegged at HK\$7.8 to the US dollar and consequent rates of exchange to other currencies. Major credit cards are generally accepted in hotels, shops and restaurants, but personal checks are only rarely accepted in Hong Kong.

Tipping

Most restaurants will add a 10% service charge to your bill and hence a tip is not required. Where there is no service charge, they will expect some loose change. You may tip hotel bellboys and airport porters. We would suggest that HK\$20 is an adequate amount.
